

**NOTIFICATION OF ARAB CONTRACTORS AND CONSULTANTS WITH

The Board of Directors of the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA), in its session held during the period 28 February-02 March 2018, has approved loans and grants for some African countries.

The total amount of funding approved is US\$ 85.46 million, of which US\$ 81.5 million are earmarked, as loans, to co-finance 6 projects under public sector financing, US\$ 3.96 million to finance 13 technical assistance programs.

It is also part of the National Water Policy, which aims to provide drinking water services to all citizens and communities in urban and rural areas in 2025 due to the steady population growth and the increasing needs for these services through the conservation of water resources and the reconstruction and development of water production facilities and monitoring Quality. The

	work of developing, rehabilitating and repairing the system will lead to a decrease in water losses from 33% to 25% in 2035.

**Project description and components**

- The entire project includes the following components:
- Main Teaching Hospital building: 61,475 square meters (ground floor + 6 upper floors) + underground floor for services with an area of 10,670 square meters.
  - Faculty of Medicine: with an area of 18,250 square meters to accommodate 100 students.
  - The exhibition hall: with an area of 4,925 square meters to accommodate 500 seats.
  - Parking: Surface + basement floor with an area of 24,770 square meters
  - Specialized Clinics: 18,250 square meters.

As a result of the high cost estimate of the entire project (estimated at US \$ 200 million), it was agreed to split the project into two phases, as follows:

The first phase :

- Includes construction of the main teaching hospital building.

The second phase :

- Includes medical school, exhibition hall, outdoor roads, pedestrian corridors, parking lot and additional specialist clinic building.

The new Flacq Teaching Hospital will provide international standards for patients in Health Area 3.

The project includes the following main components:

- A. Civil work and ancillaries.
- B. Medical equipment: includes the supply and installation of medical equipment for different departments
- C. Furniture: includes the supply and installation of medical and non-medical furniture (medical beds and accessories, office furniture, laboratories).
- D. Consultancy Services: The consultancy services for this project include the preparation of detailed designs and tender documents, assisting the executing agency in issuing tenders, evaluating bids, awarding contracts and supervising the execution of works, including preparing the project completion report.
- E. Project Launch Workshop: It includes organizing a workshop before the start of the project, supervised by experts from BADEA to introduce BADEA's procedures of procurements of goods and services and withdrawal from the loan and follow-up implementation of the project.
